Project 24 Kenya in Udom

At Vacation Bible School this year, we are supporting the LCMS program in Kenya called Project 24. It is a program to house and take care of orphans at eight different sites in Kenya. This year we will be sending our gifts to Udom, Kenya.

Project 24 Udom is located in the northwest area of Kenya, close to the town of Kapenguria, in West Pokot County. It is home to 28 girls, ranging in grade levels 3-8 and the girls attend Chepareria Primary School, which is within walking distance of the Project 24 facility. Project 24 Udom's sustainability projects include keeping a dairy cow and a chicken house on site.

Site manager, Madam Peris, is a Lutheran Deaconess and works hard to ensure the students receive good spiritual care and instruction. They study from Luther's Small Catechism, have daily devotions and attend church each week. The students are baptized and confirmed, the same as here in the states. Britt Odemba, one of the LCMS missionaries is the blonde in the pictures. She lives in Nairobi and is Program Coordinator, Jennifer Hummel's counterpart, working directly with the students daily.

The girls daily activities include morning and evening prayers and devotions, cleaning the compound, singing in the choir and growing food in the garden.








Sunday Morning Bible Study
