Reformation Sunday

October 30, 2022 Immanuel Ev. Lutheran Church Bartlett, IL Service 9:30 a.m. In my sermon on September 25, I referred to the recent poll which revealed that the number of atheists and agnostics in our country was increasing dramatically. If the trend continues, Christians will in a few years be just another minority.



Most of us would not need a poll to tell us that. I am seldom "out and about" on Sunday morning, but when I have been, I am amazed at the number of people who clearly have not been to church or have any plans to go. National church attendance statistics and closing churches themselves tell us the same thing.

Lutherans are not proponents of "decision" theology in which our confidence is placed in the decision for Christ that we make. In the words of Jesus Himself to His first disciples,

"You did not choose me; I chose you." - John 15:16 And,

"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." - Ephesians 2:8

We clearly have no direct control over what other people think or do. But we are responsible for ourselves, and as parents for our children. And our Lord Jesus has always called His followers to BE DECISIVE.

"Follow Me,"

He simply said to His first fishermen-disciples. IMMEDIATELY they left their nets on the seashore and followed Him.

The famous Christian writer, C. S. Lewis spent many years as a cynical atheist before God changed his heart and his gifted mind and then used Lewis mightily for divine purposes. Lewis then gave a series of powerful radio talks in England which were brought together in his book Mere Christianity. Among the talks was this now well-known quotation:

"A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would NOT be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic-- on the level with a man who says he is a poached egg-- or else he would be a devil of hell. YOU MUST MAKE YOUR CHOICE.

"EITHER HE WAS AND IS THE SON OF GOD OR ELSE A MADMAN OR SOMETHING WORSE. You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon, or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God.

"But let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about his being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to."

It is a time like this that calls true Christians to be decisive, not wishy-washy, about following their Savior. Not to save ourselves. But to let Christ's calling each of us have the life-changing effect He desires-- one for our eternal welfare and His glory.

It is too easy just to be accepting of how things are. Yet all of us are affected by the attitudes of the society around us. We are truly "in the world." God has placed us here-- but to be different. NOT "OF the world."

Is there any real hope for the future of Christ's Church, which He has called His "LITTLE flock"?

How about this?

"If we are faithless, He remains faithful." - 2 Timothy 2:13

The One who came to give His all for us, decisively, is not dependent on the latest poll to survive. In the words of the Easter hymn, "Jesus Lives! The Victory's Won"---

"Jesus lives! I know full well Nothing me from Him shall sever. Neither death nor powers of hell Part me now from Christ forever. God will be my sure defense; THIS shall be my confidence." LSB 490

And these words from the now risen and ascended Head of the Church:

"Fear not, little flock. It is your Father's good pleasure toe GIVE YOU the kingdom." - Luke 12:32



When King David had gathered together all the rich materials for the temple which would be built by his son Solomon, he prayed before all the people:

"But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able thus to offer willingly? For all things come from Thee, and of Thy own have we given Thee" (I Chron. 29:14).

These words powerfully remind us that everything we are, everything we have, finally belongs to God the Great Giver and of our obligation and privilege to give in return. Saint Paul exhorts the Christians in Corinth to be generous givers:

"Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). It is sometimes said that we should "give till it hurts." But Saint Paul is telling us to give until it feels good! "God loves a cheerful giver."

Do give some thought to your offering for the support of the Church's work in this place. Ask yourself, does my offering truly reflect my gratitude for all God's blessings as my Creator and my Redeemer, including the many blessings that are mine through His Church? Could I perhaps give more than I have been giving? Of course one must carefully consider one's financial circumstances! Saint Paul instructs the Corinthians: each must give "according to what one has, not according to what one has not" (2 Cor. 8:12).
